What is a long-acting injectable (LAI)?

- A potential alternative to taking a daily pill
- An injection that is given by a healthcare provider
- · Each dose delivers medicine over an extended period of time





How LAIs work

- LAIs are injections that use the same medicine that comes in a pill form
- The medicine is released in the body slowly over time, like sand in an hourglass
- LAIs are designed to provide you with the amount of medicine you need over an extended period

A dosing schedule that meets your needs

ABILIFY ASIMTUFII® (aripiprazole) and ABILIFY MAINTENA® (aripiprazole) are long-acting injectables that may provide long-lasting symptom control* for schizophrenia. One dose could provide symptom control for up to 2 months.

- ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and ABILIFY MAINTENA both use the same active ingredient, aripiprazole, which was originally developed as an oral medication
- Oral aripiprazole has been used to treat over 1 million people with schizophrenia[†]

ONCE EVERY 2 MONTHS

ABILIFY ASIMTUFII may provide 2 months of schizophrenia symptom control* with each dose.



OR

ONCE MONTHLY

ABILIFY MAINTENA may provide 1 month of schizophrenia symptom control* with each dose.



Work with your doctor to decide which dosing schedule might be right for you.

Study results

ABILIFY MAINTENA® (aripiprazole) and ABILIFY ASIMTUFII® (aripiprazole) are designed to help control schizophrenia symptoms without the need for a daily pill. See below to learn about the results of clinical studies for each of these LAIs.



Once-monthly ABILIFY MAINTENA was shown to significantly improve symptoms.



A 12-week study of people with schizophrenia* found that those who were treated with ABILIFY MAINTENA showed **significant improvement in their symptoms** compared to those who were not treated with ABILIFY MAINTENA. In fact, people given ABILIFY MAINTENA had improved symptoms in as soon as 1 week.



Shown to give more time between relapses

In a separate, 1-year study of 403 people with schizophrenia,[†] the 269 people treated with ABILIFY MAINTENA remained **relapse-free**[‡] **for a significantly longer time than the 134 people on placebo**.[§]

- *This study of ABILIFY MAINTENA measured the improvement of symptoms in 339 people with acutely relapsed schizophrenia.
- †This study of ABILIFY MAINTENA measured how well ABILIFY MAINTENA controlled symptoms in 403 people with schizophrenia.
- ‡Relapse was defined as an increase in conceptual disorganization, hallucinations, suspiciousness, or unusual thoughts; hospitalization due to worsening psychotic symptoms; severe suicidal thoughts or attempted suicide; violent behavior resulting in injury to oneself or another person or property damage. Once every-2-months ABILIFY ASIMTUFII was approved based on key studies.

One of these was the 1-year study of ABILIFY MAINTENA shown above.



Another study^{||} showed that the medicine in ABILIFY ASIMTUFII stayed at a similar level in the body for 2 months as the medicine in ABILIFY MAINTENA did for 1 month.

This 8-month study included 81 people with bipolar I disorder and 185 people with schizophrenia. The study measured the similarity of concentrations of medicine (aripiprazole) between ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and ABILIFY MAINTENA after 28 days of treatment with ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and 56 days of treatment with ABILIFY MAINTENA.

Possible side effects

The side effects of ABILIFY MAINTENA® (aripiprazole) were evaluated in a 12-week study of 339 people living with schizophrenia. The safety profile of ABILIFY ASIMTUFII® (aripiprazole) is based on the safety profile of ABILIFY MAINTENA.

In the 12-week study, the most common side effects of ABILIFY MAINTENA were:



Weight gain



Inner sense of restlessness (feeling like you need to move)



Injection site pain



Sleepiness (sedation)

These are not all the possible side effects.

In the study, the most common side effects were defined as those that happened with an incidence equal to or more than 5% and at least twice that of those taking placebo.



In this study, no one stopped treatment with ABILIFY MAINTENA because of these 4 most common side effects.

What to expect with your injections



The ABILIFY ASIMTUFII® (aripiprazole) and ABILIFY MAINTENA® (aripiprazole) injections are given by a doctor, nurse, or pharmacist. Talk to your doctor to learn more about how you'll receive them.

ABILIFY ASIMTUFII is injected just below the waistline in the upper gluteal muscle. ABILIFY MAINTENA is injected into the upper gluteal muscle or the shoulder.

You may need to loosen a belt or a waistband, but there typically is no need to remove clothing.

What did people in a study say about pain?



Most people did not feel pain

In a study, about 8 out of 10 people receiving ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and 9 out of 10 people receiving ABILIFY MAINTENA did not report feeling injection site pain.



Pain was low

Those who said they felt pain rated their pain as less than 4 on a scale from 0 to 100.



Pain lessened over time

Most people who said they felt injection site pain reported that the pain lessened with each injection.

Options for where to get your injections

You have options to receive your injection. Beyond your doctor's office, some **retail pharmacies** and **local care clinics** also give LAI injections.

Tips for getting started and staying on track

Before starting

- Talk to your doctor or nurse about other medications you're taking, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines
- Do not start or stop any medicines while taking these LAIs without talking to your doctor first

When starting

- Work with your doctor to decide the right time to start your LAI and the appropriate steps to transition from your current medication
- If you are taking an oral antipsychotic (including aripiprazole), your doctor may have you continue to take it for up to 2 weeks after your first LAI injection

After you've started

- · Receiving every dose and sticking to your treatment schedule are important to help keep the level of medicine in your body consistent
- If you miss a dose, talk to your doctor about how and when to make up the missed dose

- » Weight gain. You and your healthcare provider should check your weight regularly during treatment.
- Unusual and uncontrollable (compulsive) urges.
 Some people receiving ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA have had unusual strong urges to gamble and gambling that cannot be controlled (compulsive gambling). Other compulsive urges include sexual urges, shopping, and eating or binge eating. If you or your family members notice that you are having unusual urges or behaviors, talk to your healthcare provider.
- Decreased blood pressure (orthostatic hypotension).
 You may feel lightheaded or faint when you rise too quickly from a sitting or lying position.
- Falls. ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and ABILIFY MAINTENA may make you sleepy or dizzy, may cause a decrease in your blood pressure when changing position (orthostatic hypotension), and can slow your thinking and motor skills, which may lead to falls that can cause fractures or other injuries.
- Low white blood cell count. Your healthcare provider may do blood tests during the first few months of treatment.

Important Safety Information (continued)

ABILIFY ASIMTUFII® (aripiprazole) or ABILIFY MAINTENA® (aripiprazole) may cause serious side effects, including (continued):

- Seizures (convulsions)
- Sleepiness, drowsiness, feeling tired, difficulty thinking and doing normal activities. Do not drive a car, operate machinery, or do other dangerous activities until you know how ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA affects you. ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA may make you feel drowsy and affect your judgement, thinking, or motor skills.
- Problems controlling your body temperature so that you feel too warm. Do not become too hot or dehydrated during treatment with ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA. Do not exercise too much. In hot weather, stay inside in a cool place if possible. Stay out of the sun. Do not wear too much clothing or heavy clothing. Drink plenty of water.
- Difficulty swallowing that can cause food or liquid to get into your lungs.

Do not drink alcohol during treatment with ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA.

Before receiving ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA, tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you:

- have never taken aripiprazole before
- have or had diabetes or high blood sugar or a family history of diabetes or high blood sugar
- have or had high levels of total cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, or triglycerides, or low levels of HDL cholesterol
- have or had low or high blood pressure
- · have or had heart problems or a stroke
- have or had a low white blood cell count
- have or had seizures (convulsions)
- have problems that may affect you receiving an injection in your buttocks (ABILIFY ASIMTUFII and ABILIFY MAINTENA) or arm (ABILIFY MAINTENA)
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant.
 ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA may
 harm your unborn baby. If you become pregnant
 during treatment with ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or
 ABILIFY MAINTENA, talk to your healthcare provider
 about the risk to your unborn baby and about
 registering with the National Pregnancy Registry for
 Atypical Antipsychotics. You can register by calling

are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed.
 ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA can
 pass into your milk and may harm your baby. Talk
 to your healthcare provider about the best way to
 feed your baby if you receive ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or
 ABILIFY MAINTENA.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription medicines and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA and other medicines may affect each other, causing possible serious side effects. Do not start or stop any medicines during treatment with ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA without talking to your healthcare provider first.

The most common side effects of ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA include: weight gain, restlessness or feeling like you need to move (akathisia), injection site pain, or sleepiness (sedation).

It is important to contact your healthcare provider if you experience prolonged, abnormal muscle spasms or contractions, which may be signs of a condition called dystonia.

These are not all the possible side effects of ABILIFY ASIMTUFII or ABILIFY MAINTENA.
